Bee Bits

This has been a crazy season for beekeeping. There have been huge yard-to-yard variations in the honey crop. The lower elevation yards just didn't have enough time to build up after the rains to take full advantage of the bloom. Then hot weather hit, and dried up the nectar for several days.

When cooler weather returned, the flow resumed!

What I'm seeing is that, as expected, strong hives put on a lot of honey; weak hives may not have even been able to put on enough stores for winter. BTW, the honey this year tastes great!

I've just sent off my most recent article for ABJ—I've developed a really useful model that graphically demonstrates mite buildup in hives, and the effects of location, weather, mite resistance, splitting, and treatments. I'll demo it at a meeting soon!

Russian bee update: I'm liking the Russians more and more as an appropriate bee for Nevada County, and am expanding my number of Russian yards.

I also recently finished an early-summer test of the new formic acid product, Mite-Away Quick Strips (MAQS). This is an amazing product—easy to apply, and very effective. Plus it can be used even when honey supers are on! I'll put the full article up on my website after it comes out in ABJ in a month. Meanwhile, here is a photo from the article, demonstrating the amount of nectar shake on Hwy 174 on July 7.
